

Research Catalyst Fund

Applications are invited for funding of collaborative projects that help mature development of the system's research themes and establish our distinctive strengths and needs as we seek substantial external funding in these areas of Health and Social Care Research:

- addressing health inequalities
- digital and data enabled research
- sustainable healthcare
- translational research

Funding available: NHS Sussex has generously allocated £30,000 towards this call which will be administered centrally by the Health Research Partnership Team.

Applications are expected to be in the region of £7,000 to £10,000 and funding can be requested to cover:

- Patient and Public Involvement and Engagement activities
- Co-production activities
- Consumables
- Conference and travel
- Dissemination and publishing

Requests for costs to cover small items of equipment may be considered if spending is achievable in the timeline and in accordance with the Institutions' procurement rules.

Costings are expected to be developed with the Institutions' research development teams and following usual internal approval processes.

Eligibility:

This call is open to applicants across Sussex working in research-active institutions at any career stage. This includes researchers at Universities, NHS Trusts, Primary care and out of hospital settings, Local Authorities, Voluntary, community and Social Enterprises.

Proposals involving Early Career Researcher development are particularly encouraged with the appropriate support and group of collaborators. Proposals must have a strong focus on co-production and impact. If you are seeking a collaborative partner for your project, please get in touch for early advice and guidance.

Applicants should demonstrate previous experience of working in place-based themes relevant to HRP

- addressing health inequalities
- digital and data enabled research
- sustainable healthcare
- translational research

Assessment Criteria:

Proposals will be evaluated against the level to which it addresses the strategic aims of our partnership, specifically:

- Development of collaborative research addressing local and national priorities
- Strength of patient and public co-production/involvement and engagement plans, with a strong focus on increasing diversity in research participation and involvement (We strongly recommend collaborating with relevant VSCEs and to seek out advice and support from your organisation and/or from the Research Engagement Network)
- Development of a multidisciplinary research workforce
- Strength of pathway towards a high-quality proposal for substantive funding
- Clear pathway to evidence-driven improvements in services
- Development of commercial and charitable partnerships

Applications should clearly demonstrate a strong collaborative approach to research co-production and impact plans.

All applications will be considered by members of the HRP Executive Group. All applications will be provided with feedback and guidance even if not awarded.
